Introduction

The Centre for Health in All Policies Research Translation (CHiAPRT) is an affiliated centre of Health Translation SA and the University of Adelaide and has been established to work with policy-makers and academics at the international and national level. It aims to increase research-policy translation in ways that delivers improved public policy, and leads to better health, wellbeing, and equity outcomes.

CHiAPRT's Purpose

CHiAPRT has been established to bridge the gap between the generation of research and its application to policy and practice. CHiAPRT works across disciplinary and sectoral

boundaries to foster collaborative action between researchers and policy actors, strengthening relationships, building capacity, and contributing to improved public policy and community outcomes. Ultimately, the Centre for Health in All Policies Research Translation aims to create new knowledge at the interface of research and policy. It aims to strengthen existing knowledge and then translate these lessons to the wider research and government sectors including and beyond the health sector at a national and global level.

CHiAPRT is supported by Affiliated Partners and an Advisory Committee and operates as a multi-institutional Centre, with each Affiliated Partner collaborating on demonstration projects or research activities in line with their interest and capacity.
